4. In what ways have you been motivated to give more generously or to dedicate yourself more fully by observing the personal example of Christian leaders?
5. What does David's prayer in [1 Chron. 29:10-13](#) reveal about his view of God?
6. How is our view of God related to our willingness or unwillingness to give generously?

7. David might have felt boastful about his giving. What do [1 Chron. 29:14-19](#) reveal about his reasons for humility?

8. David might also have felt remorse about parting with so much of his wealth. Instead, what spiritual and emotional impact did it have on him and the people ([1 Chron. 29:20-25](#))?

9. According to this chapter, in what other ways can we express our devotion to the Lord?

10. [1 Chron. 29:26-30](#) records the death of David. How do the events in this chapter provide a fitting conclusion to his life?

11. What have you appreciated most about studying the life of David?
